

LEMON-AID 2009: *SUVs, Vans and Trucks*

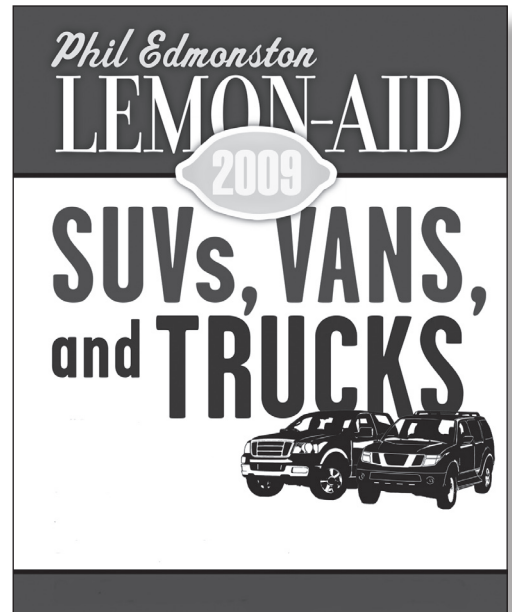

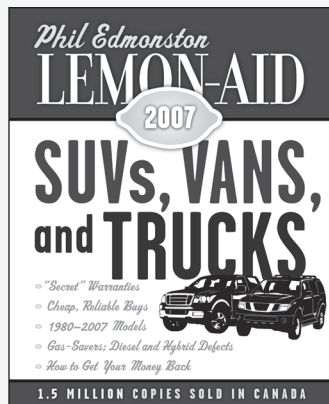
This year's 2009 guide has a few other surprises:

- The one-word request you can make to get free, or **cheaper repairs**

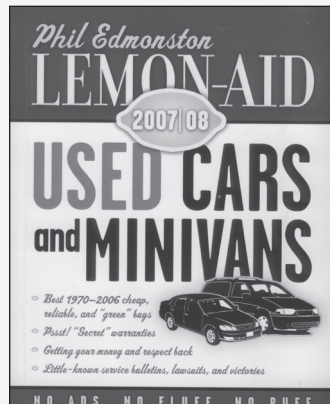


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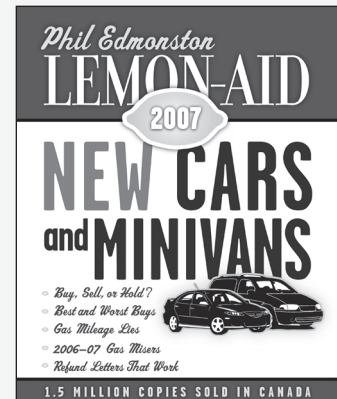
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
