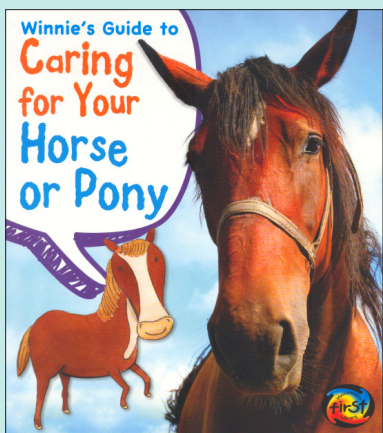
Welcome to the World of Wild Horses by Diane Swanson

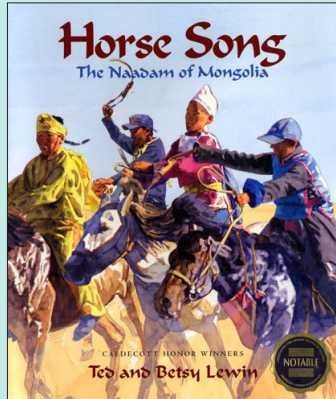
The Last Black King of the Kentucky Derby: The Story of Jimmy Winkfield by Crystal Hubbard • Illustrated by Robert McGuire

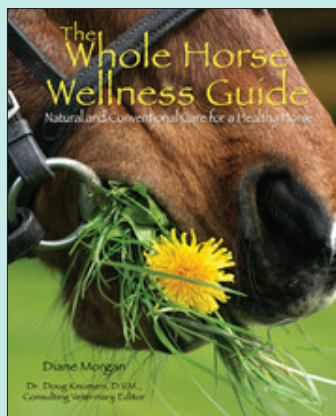

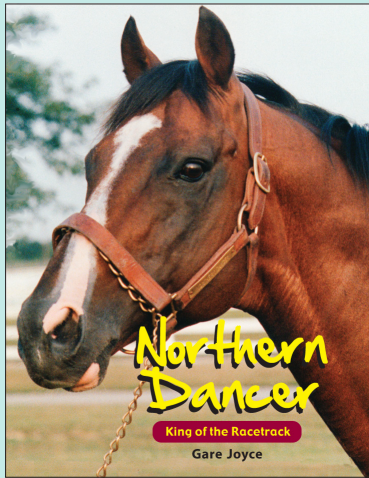

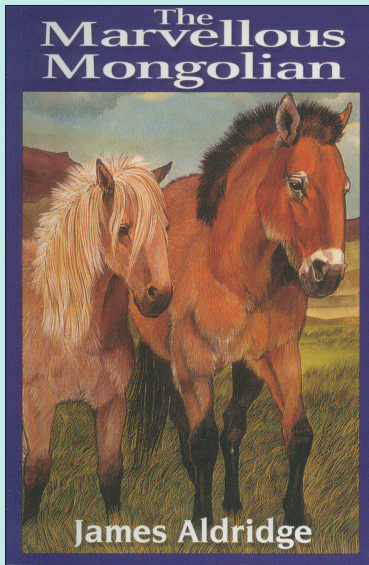
This third installment of the Larger than Life series details the astonishing success of a Canadian horse-racing legend.

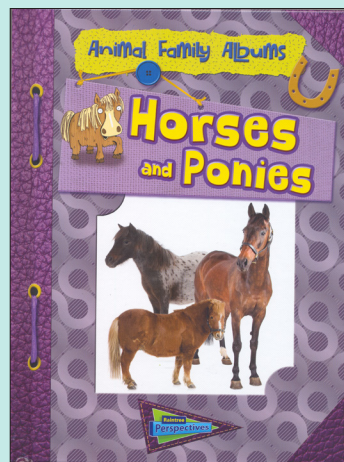
Each book in the *Mustang Mountain* series is a thrilling read filled with stories of friendship, adventure and intrigue.

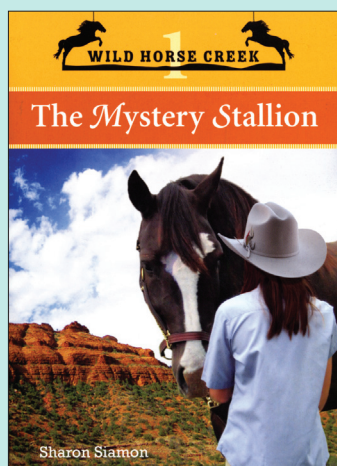


Horse Mad Series by Kathy Helidoniotis
